The browser has quietly become the most heavily used application in the enterprise, and the least governed. Most security strategies were architected around the network and the endpoint. The browser, where the actual work happens, still sits largely outside that model.

That gap is widening. Employees now use the browser to reach AI tools and services, and AI agents themselves are becoming a new class of browser user, fetching web content and acting on it, often with the same or even higher level of access as the humans they support. It's also where credential theft, highly evasive phishing, and ransomware delivery are increasingly landing. This gap is causing boards to ask harder questions, particularly as NIS2 and DORA raise the bar on operational resilience and accountability for exactly this kind of unmanaged exposure. Real cyber resilience starts upstream of that question: an enterprise that prevents these threats from ever reaching the endpoint isn't just more secure, it's more resilient by design.
